NUFARM/AH MARKS MERGER

Competition Commission invites evidence

The Office of Fair Trading (OFT) has referred the completed acquisition by Nufarm Limited (Nufarm) of AH Marks Holdings Limited (AH Marks) to the Competition Commission (CC).

The CC has been asked to decide whether the acquisition may be expected to result in a substantial lessening of competition within any market or markets in the UK for goods or services, including that for the supply of two phenoxy acetic acids, technically known as 'MCPA' and '2,4-D', which are chemicals used to make herbicides.

The CC is expected to report by 12 February 2009.

Notes for editors

1. The CC is an independent public body, which carries out investigations into mergers, markets and the regulated industries.
2. The Enterprise Act 2002 empowers the OFT to refer to the CC completed or proposed mergers for investigation and report which create or enhance a 25 per cent share of supply in the UK (or a substantial part thereof) or where the UK turnover associated with the enterprise being acquired is over £70 million.
3. The CC has a 24-week period in which it is required to publish its report, which may be extended by no more than eight weeks if it considers that there are special reasons why the report cannot be published within that period.
